1 John 4:19 - We love because he first loved us.



SELC PANDEMIC PROTOCOLS UPDATE

As many read in the email accompanying the Pentecost Worship bulletin last Thursday, your COVID-19 Response Team revised our protocols based on the CDC's May 13th announcement that "fully vaccinated people no longer need to wear a mask or physically distance in any setting, except where required by federal, state, local, tribal, or territorial laws, rules, and regulations, including local business and workplace guidance..." and that it is highly recommended that unvaccinated people keep wearing masks. After prayerful discernment and discussion, your Response Team decided:

- 1) To continue to ask that worshipers wear masks while in the sanctuary until vaccinations are more widespread and include children. Those for whom wearing a mask is physically untenable are welcome to wear a plastic face shield that they bring with them or we can provide. We believe that mask-wearing continues to fulfill our calling to share Jesus' love by protecting the most vulnerable among us. Masks are optional while socializing outside on the patio.
- 2) To continue the option of singing with masks on.
- 3) That worshipers have the option of sitting distanced in the north and south pew sections or to sit without having to be distanced in the center pew sections. We ask that those who may typically sit in those side sections graciously offer to sit in other areas if space is needed for those who prefer distancing.
- 4) That we will no longer require temperatures being taken before entering.
- 5) That we will ask worshipers to continue to RSVP for the next two Sundays until we see how things are working out with the lifting of these restrictions and to help us discern if we need to add another worship service.
- 6) That we will soon return hymnals and Bibles into the pew racks for use during worship. A few paper bulletins will be available for any who would like one while in worship and we will continue to email out the bulletin on Fridays.
- 7) That, starting May 30th, worshipers will have the option of taking their individually wrapped communion "cups" to the altar to partake there or remain in the pews while taking communion. (Note: We now have new "cups" that are easier to open.)
- 8) That up to three people can join in providing song leadership or special music.

We hope and trust that taking these steps will assist in making our worship experience that much more enjoyable while at the same time continuing to keep us all as safe as we can, recognizing that we can't entirely eliminate all risks. We welcome any feedback or input you may have about these and other changes. Our next Response Team meeting is scheduled for June 7, 2021.
