Pastor's Message:

*“He has told you, O mortal, what is good;
and what does the Lord require of you
but to do justice, and to love kindness,
and to walk humbly with your God?”*

Micah 6:8

As I wrote last week, COVID-19 already prompts anxiety for a lot of us. It is made that much more anxious and fearful a time now by the violence and destruction around our country that has occurred alongside angry yet peaceful protests in response to the death of George Floyd. But, of course, this isn't just about anger over one death. It's expressing anger, frustration and impatience with too many other injustices over too many years heaped upon our African-American siblings and other people of color. We decry and denounce the destruction of property and physical injury. We can understand the depth of pain that is behind these protests. While there has been progress in civil rights since the '60's, all this reveals how far we have yet to go.

Micah's call has become more relevant and urgent than ever before. While we pray to God to calm our fears and we try to limit our news intake to keep from being over-loaded, we also pray that true justice might be done in our country. We lament with those who are crying. We pray for the safety of our law enforcement personnel, National Guard, and protestors. We pray for wisdom and compassion on the part of our elected decision-makers. We look for ways to advocate for reforms and improvements in our legal system and our law enforcement policies and practices. We don't remain silent in the face of prejudice and bigotry but seek to model and lift up Christ-love for all. We practice deep listening to our aggrieved neighbors of color. We participate in and give thanks for the classes that Intern Pastor Paul is leading on these exact issues, focused on our Native American siblings. Most of all, we witness to the way that, at Pentecost, the Holy Spirit was gifted upon “all flesh” (Acts 2:17), all people, regardless of their cultural background, ethnic origin, gender, ages and stages of life. That energizes us to speak up, speak out, and keep acting against the diminishment and disregard of all those God calls His children. It is the universal Love of God for ALL creation that keeps us working to fulfill the prayer, “thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.”

COVID-19 RESPONSE TEAM UPDATE

Our next SELC COVID-19 Response Team meeting is this Thursday, June 4th, 6:30 pm. We will again assess and evaluate the most current information received and update the congregation of our decisions soon after that. It is important to note that Bishop Hutterer of the Grand Canyon Synod emailed a letter on May 28th that included these words:

“To date, infections number over 17,000 in Arizona and over 8,000 in both Nevada and Utah. Over 1,300 people have died in the three states... Such statistics testify this is not the time to gather in-person...I have encouraged that there be no in-person gathering until the deaths or cases of newly infected decrease for a minimum of 14 days. At that point, small groups under ten could begin to gather. After 28 days of decrease, groups of less than 50 could begin to gather.” If you'd like to read the full letter, go to our website, www.selcaz.org or call the office and we'll mail it to you.
